



COMPETITION RULES



This event will be conducted under the **Equestrian Australia National Dressage Rules effective 1 January 2025**. https://www.equestrian.org.au/Dressage-rules

Please take time to familiarise with the current Rules. It is the responsibility of the rider to know the Rules under which they compete.

Neither the Organisation Committee of any competition to which the Rules apply or Equestrian Australia accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, grounds, spectators or any other person or property.

All riders must have their horse's registration and pony height certificates available for inspection.

Notifications

Information and updates will be provided on the Championships Facebook page: https://www.facebook.com/TasDressageChamps.

Scratchings

Notification should be made by 5.00pm the day prior to competition. Refunds are available as per Dressage Tasmania's Refund Policy.

Gear Check

Gear check is compulsory for each test and failure to have a gear check will entail elimination.

Conducted by accredited Equestrian Australia Stewards or those appointed by same **AFTER** a completed test. A horse float will be located between the arenas with clear signage.

Riders WILL NOT be reminded to have a gear check following a test.

Gear check will be in accordance with the Equestrian Australia Equipment Annex and EA Accredited Stewards.

Bridle Numbers

Must be worn on both sides of bridle or saddle pad AND both sides of halter when horse is not being ridden.

Lunging

Only to be conducted in the round yard on the Eastern side of the grounds.

Warm up

The **Bell Bay Aluminium** warm up arena is the large sand, fenced arena on the Eastern side of the Grounds and should be used when preparing for competition.

The grassed area beside the competition arenas is to be used prior to entering an arena for competition. Please take direction from Arena Marshallers and Stewards.

Please be aware of your start time and present to the relevant arena, ride around the arena and ensure your ID Number is recognised by all Judges.

Coaches

Coaching to be conducted from the edge of the warm up arena through headsets only.

Swabbing

Random swabbing will occur throughout the competition. Information can be found here:

Presentations

Calculation of awards and placings

Excerpt from EA National Dressage Rules, effective 1 January 2025:

3.19 Awards and placings

Awards are made to place getters, irrespective of percentage received.

The following is a guide:

- a) up to 5 starters, ribbons to 3rd place
- b) up to 15 starters, ribbons to 5th place
- c) more than 15 starters, ribbons to 8th place
- d) in case of equality of percentage for any of the first three places, the higher total of the collective mark/s, including coefficients, will decide on the placings
- e) should there still be a tie, the rider score will be the final decider
- f) when there is equality of places from fourth place and below, the competitors are joint equal place getters

In the following cases, places will be determined as follows:

- g) in the case of equality of marks for first place in a Freestyle test, the combination with the higher mark, including coefficients for artistic presentation, will be the winner. If there is still equality, then they are equal winners
- h) for the purpose of a one-off trophy or point-score award, if a clear winner is required, one of the following criteria should be decided upon and included in the Conditions of Entry:
 - total the collective marks of each tied competitor. The one with the highest total collective marks is the winner
 - if two tests are involved, the award should be to the competitor with the highest score in the highest test involved
- i) For the purpose of deciding a Champion at a level (between two or more tests), points shall be allocated to each horse according to their placing in each competition; first placed horses will be allocated 35 points, second 34 points and so on until the last placed horse. In case of a tie for any placing in a competition, each horse will receive the same points (e.g. equal 6th placed horses each receive 30 points). Only horses who competed in all tests are eligible for Champion. The Champion is the horse with the highest combined points.
 - Ties: In the case of a tie in championship points, the horse with the higher aggregate percentage will have the better placing. If still tied, the horse with the higher percentage in the highest competition in the Championship will have the better placing.

Spectators

Please keep to designated areas. Refer to Mud Map of the grounds. Watch out for horses at all times.

Children

Children under 10 years are to be under adult supervision.

Dressage Tasmania is a Child Safe organisation.

First Aid

Available at the central Containers. Qualified First Aid officers will be on site.

Dogs are not permitted on the grounds at any time.

Parking

Please take direction from parking Marshallers and refer to the Map of Grounds.





Serving of alcohol

In Tasmania, it is a requirement to hold a responsible serving of alcohol (RSA) certificate to serve alcohol in a licensed venue and those who serve alcohol need to have successfully completed an approved RSA course.

Those serving alcohol need to be able to demonstrate the responsible sale and service of liquor, to keep people safe and minimise the risk of harm through the misuse of liquor.

Considerations include, but are not limited to:

- Supervision over the service of liquor
- Monitoring for and prevention of intoxication
- When and how you stop or refuse service
- What you may do if someone considers drink driving
- How you will limit the exposure of liquor to children
- What policies, procedures and staff training are in place
- What control measures are in place such as signs or identification checks
- An understanding of the day-to-day operations of the licensed premises

The Liquor Licensing Act 1990 makes it an offence to sell or serve liquor on licensed premises or permit premises to a person who is believed on reasonable grounds to be intoxicated.

Evidence of age documents are required to prove that a person is 18 years of age or over and is legally able to purchase liquor and/or remain in restricted and prohibited areas.

Employees who sell or serve liquor must be at least 16 years of age (18 years of age in some circumstances) and hold the appropriate RSA course accreditation attained from an approved Registered Training Organisation Serving includes the employee taking the drink order, the employee preparing the drinks and the employee taking the drinks to the table.

Employees who are under 18 years of age who have possession or control of liquor must be working under the direct and personal supervision of an adult at all times, and can only sell or serve in areas in which they are legally permitted to enter and remain.

If an area is designated as a prohibited area under section 84(1) of the Liquor Licensing Act 1990, then staff who sell, serve or supply liquor must be over 18 years of age. The minimum age of 16 applies in all other areas (including those designated as a restricted area under section 84(2) of the Act).

HOUSEKEEPING

Writing – If you have been allocated a slot writing for a judge, please be ready to go at the correct ring a few minutes before you are due to start. The judge who is named first will be at C and the second judge will be in the huts. If you can help out in any way, please sing out.

Helmet Tagging - Please ensure your helmet is tagged before you get on. Tagging will be at the main containers. Having the correct gear is your responsibility, please ask a Steward or organising committee member if you are unsure about anything.

First aid officer – Jenny Shepherd 0239 981 113

Lunging – Must be in the round yard only. The committee have taken every effort to ensure this is a safe space and further sand has been removed.

Warm up – Must be in the large, fenced arena (all day), and on the grassed area next to competition arenas prior to entering for your test. Please follow directions of Marshallers in hi-vis vests.

Numbers – You must have numbers displayed either on your bridle or saddle blanket on **both sides**, 4cm or more in height. Numbers must also be displayed **both sides** of the horse's halter when not being ridden.





Arena rules apply when using the sand areas. You will be asked to leave the space if you do not obey the rules.

Arena Etiquette - F.10.2 Etiquette for the warm-up arena

As there are many horses warming up in a restricted area it is important that all riders have knowledge of the etiquette required in group riding. This ensures safe riding and achieves harmony in busy areas.

- a) safety is paramount and a collision should be avoided at all times
- b) before entering the warm-up area make sure the gateway and immediate track are clear
- c) riders should pass left shoulder to left shoulder when on the outside track
- d) when not on the outside track, e.g. on a diagonal line, riders should give way to horses on their left
- e) the more progressive gait has priority on the track (e.g. horses trotting should give way to horses cantering)
- f) a halt should not be on the track
- g) walking should not be on the track and does not have right of way
- h) trot has priority over walk
- i) canter has priority over trot
- j) lateral work has priority over all paces
- k) when circling, anticipate your return to the track so as to not stop the flow of other riders
- I) mounting, dismounting and gear adjustment should be done off the track
- m) consideration should be given to behaviour of other horses in the arena that may upset your horse
- n) it may be necessary to leave the area if your horse is upsetting others
- o) if a horse is upsetting the majority, an official should be sought with a view to requesting that horse's removal for safety's sake
- p) be aware of stallions wearing green stallion discs

Test Sheets – Scoring is now online and you will need to access Nominate Scoreboard, locate this competition and click Dressage Results to find your score. Your test sheets will be emailed to you after you finish your test. Check with the organising committee if unsure.

Scratchings – Linda Smink on 0447 557 563.

Ride Times – Please stick to your ride times. You cannot go in another person's allotted time unless a scratching has occurred and the Technical Delegate has approved the change.

Yards — Unfortunately not everyone could be allocated a yard, and priority was given to those who entered early, or who are working at the event. If you are on the yard list and do not need one, or leave the event earlier than expected, please let the Event Director know. Horses must be tied up in the yards at all times.

Manure and hay/feed – manure and hay MUST be picked up and removed from yards, parking area, arenas, warm up (anywhere your horse decides to deposit!) There is a pooper scooper in the equipment container if you forget to pack one. Trailers will be available for manure. Take residue hay/feed with you when you leave.












EQUESTRIAN AUSTRALIA GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT

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
